### Nutty Green Pasta

Cashew nut is one of my chief ingredients in cooking since I started practicing plant-based diet or vegan vegetarian. It can be used as a substitute for milk due to its creamy texture when processed/blended. And because of that, you can make vegan cheese out of it as well as dressing for raw vegetable salads, cream for fruit salads and sauce for main dishes. Adding cashew nuts to your recipe make your food more palatable.

When it comes to health benefits, cashew nut is categorized as food for the nervous system since it is rich in B vitamins, particularly B1, B2, and B6. It is also

rich in magnesium which helps your nerves to relax, promotes appetite, promotes healthy skin and eyes, prevents constipation and activates enzymes. Because of these vitamins and minerals found in cashew nut, it is recommended for treating illnesses like nervousness, irritability, anxiety, weakness, depression and dysmenorrhea. This wonder nut also contains good fat, protein and carbohydrates—a healthy add-on to your trail mix. So the next time you visit a healthy food store, look for cashew nuts and enjoy its healthy goodness!

#### Ingredients:

1 cup soaked cashew nuts
½ cup pure coconut milk
1½ cup fresh sweet basil leaves
3 tbsp. nutritional yeast
3 tbsp. kalamansi juice
salt to taste
1 kg cooked spiral San Remo pasta
3 pcs bulb onion, chopped
2 cloves garlic, minced
1 cup toasted peanut, grounded



#### Cooking Procedure:

- 1. Blend\* the soaked cashew nuts with a cup of water until it becomes smooth. Then add the kalamansi juice, salt, sweet basil leaves, nutritional yeast and blend it until you get the consistency you desired.
- 2. Sauté the minced garlic in the sauce pan without using oil. Stir it until the garlic becomes golden brown. Add the chopped onion and continue to stir until the aroma comes out.
- 3. Add the blended ingredients in the saucepan then put the coconut milk.
- 4. Bring to boil in a low fire. Stir constantly until the sauce becomes thick. Then pour the green creamy sauce over the pasta.
- 5. Add toasted ground peanut and mix it together.

Servings: 10-12 persons

commercial would give me a five-digit amount. I felt that I got everything in life," Robert shared, a known beautician in the TV industry.

During those moments when he thought that he had everything, God stepped in and caused him to see his real needs. One of his workmates invited him for a Bible Study. He learned many truths especially about the Sabbath and Health. His conviction to follow what he learned from the Word of God brought a drastic change in his way of living. He no longer accepted appointments on Sabbath. Thus, his clients and contact persons left him and his compensation automatically went to zero.



In the trying times of his life, God comforted him through the programs aired by Amazing Facts TV and 3ABN. Providentially, he met a PAFCOE staff and referred him to the Bible Workers. They invited him to attend the seminar at Manresa. There, he learned more of the Bible truths. After the seminar, he decided to give His life to Jesus.

"Though I lost all, I thanked God because I have that peace that passes all understanding, being right with God. Now, I just have enough. I thanked God for He has been sustaining me," he concluded.

### The Challenge

The worship services are not only attended by the newly baptized but by the regular attendees of the prophecy seminar as well. May the latter group will soon decide to join the fold. Let us keep this soon-to-be-established church in our prayers.

The next day I set out for the last visit and that time, nanay was wide awake! Her husband, tatay Ely, was present. I conducted the next lesson to the couple, but later tatay went out. He always did that whenever he was around during the Bible study.

The appointed time for the prophecy seminar to begin came. On the first day I went to their house to invite them. I saw a flyer in *tatay* Ely's hand. "Is this yours?" he asked. "Yes," I answered. "I am interested in this!" he exclaimed. So I invited him to come and he said that he will try.

Nanay Esther came so early because she wanted to avail the free health services. When the seminar was about to start, I saw *tatay* Ely walking towards the registration table. "Yes!" I uttered in joy. I prayed earnestly that he would not stop attending the seminar. And the Lord answered my plea.

One morning tatay Ely and I had a deep conversation. He told me that he couldn't understand himself why he kept on attending. According to him it seemed that somebody was pushing and telling him to go to the seminar. He shared how he bore the mockery of his friends when he

left while they were drinking alcohol so that he couldn't miss a single topic. As I listened to him, I believed that the Holy Spirit was working in his heart.


The couple continued to attend the seminar. They decided to be baptized and gave their lives to Jesus. During our outreach time, I met a good number of people who accepted the literatures I presented to them. Yes, some were hesitant at first but when the Holy Spirit worked in their heart they found the book valuable and bought it. My heart was filled with joy as I picture them reading the truth-filled publications. I have kept this in mind that the joy of serving Him is the most rewarding part of being a partaker of His work. Surely, the literature ministry is a work ordained by the Lord and those who work for Him wholly will be blessed as they become a blessing to others."—Geralyn

"My partner and I decided to do canvassing in a hospital. We met rejections but we never gave up; we prayed instead. As we passed by a window, we saw a new born baby. The father looked so happy and so we decided to offer a prayer. Then we took another step, looking for prospects. But God impressed me to give him a book as a gift. I took the *Great Controversy* and handed it to him. He smiled widely as he thanked us. We continued our canvassing work and God brought us to the persons in need of the book. Some of those we approached didn't buy, but gave us donation instead. My partner and I decided that the proceeds would be used to buy two presenters for our OJT. As we audit the money in the comfort room, we realized that it was insufficient to have even one. We prayed to the Lord that He would

provide us enough to buy two. Then we continued to walk with a hope that He will provide. As we came near to an office, we saw a woman inside talking to someone on the phone. We waited until she was done. We approached her and told her what we were doing. Towards the end of our conversation, she gave us one thousand pesos. We thanked her and offered a prayer. Before we left, she took another one thousand pesos! Tears misted our eyes as we went out. Joy filled our heart we ended our canvassing with prayer. Praise God for His faithfulness!"—Delsa

"I found canvassing as the hardest part of the training because it was my first time to do this line of work. I didn't know how to start it right. I needed more courage to approach and convince them to avail the publications.

One outreach day, before I knocked, I uttered a silent prayer. First I endorsed the Health and Peace but they answered, 'We have doctors in our family and we have a regular check-up with them, so I think we don't need that book." Then I tried to present another, but still they refused. I took the Great Controversy and presented it to them. 'Honestly, we already have those because we have spiritual counsellors and we are always going to church,' he said. I grew so hopeless at that time and felt discouraged that I didn't want to continue doing LE. But the man said, 'Maybe next time or try to endorse to others, because we already have doctors and spiritual counsellors and they are Seventh -day Adventists.' Those words gave me hope even if he didn't buy the books. I hope that through those Seventh-day Adventist counsellors they will come to know the truth.

I have learned from this experience that doing literature evangelism is not just about how much or how many books you can sell but it is all about how many souls you can win through the publications. I have realized that literature evangelism work is one of heaven's means to open the heart of people as we share to them the love of God."—Glady



"I received an FB messenger call from ate Sherly, my Bible interest four years ago while I joined literature ministry during my college days. She asked for help and expressed how she missed the time when we conducted a Bible study with her, so I decided to visit her the next day.

When I went to their house, she warmly welcomed me. I inquired her using FORT method and did a health survey to her. I found out that she's psychologically ill. She was addicted into illegal drugs before and the side effects caused her body to become weak. The fear of dying too early brought a ton of worries in her heart because her children are still young. I told her about changing her lifestyle, and amazingly I was surprised to hear her saying that she's now practicing a vegetarian diet through reading *Healthy Diet*. I told her about Jesus and since my time was short I gave her *Steps To Christ*. When she saw the other books I brought with me, she inquired

if those were for sale. I said yes. The book *The Great Controversy* caught her attention and she shared that somebody told her how nice the book was. But that time her budget was not for buying books. So I told her that I would just leave the books and she could give the payment to the Bible worker whom I planned to ask for a follow-up Bible study with her. Suddenly, she changed her mind and gave me five hundred pesos. With the books in her hand, she expressed her gratitude for visiting her in times of distress. Heavenly joy filled me as we prayed together before I bade her goodbye."—*Ralph*

### Q: Was Judas Iscariot Predestined to Betray Jesus?

The gospel of Matthew depicts the betrayal of Judas Iscariot as a prophetic fulfillment. Psalm 49:1 contains the prophecy, "Yea, mine own familiar friend, in whom I trusted, which did eat of my bread, hath lifted up his heel against me," and is fulfilled in Matt. 26:14, 48-49. Another prophecy found in Zechariah 11:12-13 states, "I told them, 'If you think it best, give me my pay; but if not, keep it.' So they paid me thirty pieces of silver. And the LORD said to me, 'Throw it to the potter'—the handsome price at which they priced me!' So I took the thirty pieces of silver and threw them into the house of the LORD to the potter;" its fulfillment is recorded in Matt. 27:3-5.

The passages above show that God knew Judas would betray Jesus—the betrayal that led Jesus to die on the cross for the redemption of mankind. But this reality sometimes prompts people to ask, "Does it mean that Judas was predestined to betray Him?" The certainty that God can see the future is a fact that we cannot argue. He knows everyone whether he/she will choose to love Him and obey or to choose to deny Him and reject His saving grace. Now, does that mean God predestined everyone? The answer is NO.

Isaiah 46:10 tells us, "Declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times the things that are not yet done, saying, My counsel shall stand, and I will do all my pleasure." God knows our choices before we are even born, but it does not mean that He causes us to become thus. I am sure Jesus did everything to bring the truth to the heart of Judas. Prophecy was written not because God decides who will be saved or not, rather it was written for us to see that He knows our choices and the results of them.

The Holy Spirit inspired Zechariah to prophesy with regards to Judas' betrayal and this simply means that Judas would eventually choose to betray Jesus, not because God caused it but because Judas chose to. The Bible also clarifies that Satan entered unto Judas and led him to betray Jesus (John 13:26-27). In his life, Judas had choices to make and all of his choices led him to be a vessel of Satan's evil workings for the betrayal of the Savior.

God knows our choices in the future and it should not cause us trouble, instead joy and confidence in Him. The Bible tells us in Jeremiah 29:11, "For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the LORD, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end."
