STUDENT LIFE

In this world, I was really enjoying all the pleasures, not noticing that I would be drifted away astray. All my life before was for wealth, fame, and possession. I did not think about anything spiritual. Though I was attending church, I still compromised with a lot of things. I compromised Sabbath, health and so on. I was not thinking about what my future would bring, the signs of the times, and the big issues about the coming of the Son of Man. I knew that Jesus is coming, but that was not my priority. I was really blinded with everything in this world.

Then one time, terrible rashes came out from my body. I did not mind what that was because I was used to have rashes every time I go to the gym from extreme and rigid workout. Then another symptom came out. Still, because I was really stubborn, I did not mind it and had to bear all those things. Then symptoms from symptoms came out.

The year was 2017, when I was really bombarded with terrible pain and I was very weak. I had difficulty in walking. I was trying to move using my hip and butt, and even crawled. I was in tears with terrible tremendous pain. My hair began to fall that it could easily be plucked out and pulled out.

The hair would just stick on the hands. I lose weight. I had joint pains and some parts of my body were getting deformed. I had an unbearable headache, that the pain seemed being pounded by a hammer or a rock. Then it came to the point that I could no longer move. I was bed-ridden for almost five months. I had difficulty in eating and even in drinking because I could not hold anything—nor glass, spoon, and any utensil. Thus, my mom was the one who fed me, gave me water to drink, and helped me up with all things. You cannot help as well just to feel pity about how bad and desperate my situation was.

After a series of tests, I was diagnosed to have an autoimmune disease- Systemic Lupus Erythematous (SLE) with Rheumatoid Arthritis factor. I stayed in the hospital for a long time. There, they medicated and looked for means to cure my disease. But all of their efforts were in vain. Until the doctors told me that I had few hours to live, because they could not help my situation anymore. They did all their best to give me medication and treatment, but my body was no longer responding.

When the physicians frankly told me and my family about my situation, I came to realize that I did not have a chance to live long. I really had difficulty in breathing, for the cardiovascular was terribly and desperately affected. Even in talking was not a good chance to do so. I cried to the Lord for the forgiveness of my sins. I admitted all my pasts' terrible mistakes and sins. I know that God had called me to be His servant for the vineyard, yet I walked in the other way just as Jonah who did not attend directly to his call for mission. Besides from breaking the heart of my family and mine, I really broke the heart of the One who gives life and who owns this very life. There, I accepted that I would die just as what I heard and saw from people's actions and expressions when they came in to visit me.



However, something unexplainable happened. I could not tell how it exactly happened but God showed His healing mercy and miracle to me. One day, I believe my mom had a miraculous encounter with a heavenly being, when she casually communicated and talked with a stranger who visited the hospital. The stranger assured my Mom that I was healed. On that same day, the doctor told me that I had few hours to live, but I felt that I was able to breathe normally! I, then, was able to move my hand and took off my oxygen because it seemed there was too much air coming in. Before that day ended, I was able to hum my favorite song. I concluded, God extended my life! Then I remembered one of the promises that I hold on to "I will not leave you comfortless, I will come to you (John 14:18)."

Yes! God did not leave me when I was in pain. God did not cover His Divine ears to hear my terrible cry for forgiveness and sorrow for my sins. He was there when I needed Him the most. He was there when I looked for someone to lean on. He was there to comfort me and mostly He was there when the world could not anymore help my illness.

It was Him who visited and came to heal me, just as how He had healed the people in the past. Despite my so-called incurable sickness and the declared few remaining hours of my life, nothing is impossible to the all-powerful great God! He is able to do what the finite beings cannot do.

Such a miracle! Everyone was amazed and eye-glaring shocked with what had happened. Right then, I was able to move and hold things. The physicians told me the following day that God loves me so much. Of all their experiences as medical expertise, that was their first to see an incurable sick patient that was still able to live. God showed that miracle to me, to be a witness to the people in there. And so, I made a great covenant to the God in heaven, that I would use this life for Him. I want to serve Him with all my life and to minister just as I was being ministered to.

Since then, my journey as a missionary began. I had myself trained at PAFCOE to minister, to share the gospel of salvation, to reach the unreached, and to win souls for Christ. Though, sometimes, I had attacks even during the training process and even during the OJT, it did not stun and struck me to stop working for Christ in His great vineyard. Matthew 28:18-20 is always in mind that He will never leave us as we work for Him, even unto the end of the age. Now as a Bible worker of PAFCOE, I determined to keep moving for God's cause and for this purpose. Because I was healed all by Christ, I will live all for Christ.

When we are tried and tested in this world, God is the only source of the solution, strength, and everything. Trials and severe tests could come in the form of sickness & diseases, and it could come even





As I was starting to get very busy with all of the events I was handling, a package was delivered to me. I was not expecting to receive a Bible with a letter from my mother. She wrote there: "How are you my daughter? No one else can help you with your problems but God. Please go back to Him. I will fervently pray every day for you." After reading, I just inserted the letter back in the Bible and placed it on the shelves. I never had any plans of opening that Bible again until one day, as I was alone in the shop waiting for a customer, my eyes were suddenly fixed on the Bible from a distance. Instantly, I sensed an unexplainable desire to get it. I took out the Bible from the shelves and opened it to the book of Psalm. As I was reading, every line seems like a stab to my heart. Tears flooded from me as I was reading about forgiveness and reconciliation to God. I cried uncontrollably that I found myself kneeling down trying to utter words of prayer. Struggling to pray after ten years of being backslidden, though I was not really able to convey what was in my thoughts, I know God heard my cries for help and repentance. One time, there was a one-month evangelistic seminar conducted by Amazing Facts-Philippines on which I happened to attend. I learned so much about the fundamentals of Adventism which I never learned in my past Bible studies. I realized that I was not a good witness to my family because I helped them sell unclean food, and other unhealthy beverages in our store. I felt guilty for being an accessory in ruining the health of the people.

I wanted to know God deeply and give my life into His service but I do not know where and how to start. In God's providence, PAFCOE opened a training that time. I thought of it as an answer to my prayer, and I was determined to join the training. Knowing my decision, my family was angry and not willing to support me for the finances. However, God used some people to help me with my enrollment. And so, I became a part of PAFCOE's 2nd Batch of trainees.

Since then, my journey as a full-time missionary began. I graduated from PAFCOE, and I was called to become one of their workers. My life literally turned upside down from being a business woman to a full-time evangelist. The Party Coordinator that I once was, is now a Children Evangelism Coordinator and General Needs Coordinator of PAFCOE. Imagine, I was pulled out from the work of the world to the work of our Lord. By God's grace, my skills and efforts were put into use for the advancement of God's cause.

They ask pieces of advice, that is why we always ask God's guidance on what to say. Because I specialized on Child Evangelism at PAFCOE, I take time as well on teaching children aside from our Bible studies, together with my partner.
